**VARIOUS ROADS, SHEPWAY AREA
– SURFACE TREATMENTS**

(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING)

TEMPORARY ORDER 2018

To allow a countywide programme of carriageway Surface Treatment works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on various roads throughout the Shepway District.

Works involve several phases which may each require a road closure to allow the works to be safely carried out, so there might be up to 3 closures per road.

Phases include patching beforehand, application of the surface treatment itself, followed by works to allow for the reinstatement of road markings and adjustment of iron-works (road drain covers, manhole covers, etc.) to suit the new surface.

The dates of closures have yet to be fully fixed at the time this is being issued. Once the works have been programmed, the actual dates of closures will be publicised beforehand, sign-posted on site and notified to local residents.

Closures will generally be within the times 07:00 hours and 19:00 hours each day, but certain works may need to be carried out outside these times, where there is a specific need for this.

This programme is subject to weather and other factors which may potentially cause changes at short notice; every effort will be made to keep as close as possible to the planned dates that are notified. Any changes will be publicised.

Once the Surface Treatment works have been carried out, a temporary speed limit of 20 mph may need to be imposed in place on certain roads for a period of up to 7 days. Where this does apply, the 20 mph Speed Limit will be clearly indicated by relevant signs displayed on site.

This Order comes into force from 19 February 2018 and remains in force until the works have been completed, with a maximum duration of 18 months.

The roads affected, extents of closures and alternative routes are as shown below, listed in alphabetical order of town or village.

MILL ROAD / EASTBRIDGE ROAD, DYMCHURCH

Closure between A259 High Street and St Ann's Road

Alternative route via A259 High Street, Hythe Road, Burmarsh Road, Thorndike Road and Church Road (Burmarsh) back to Eastbridge Road

DEAN BOTTOM, ELMSTEAD

Closure between Elchin Hill and Podlinge & Ittinge Lane

Alternative route via Dean Bottom, Podlinge & Ittinge Lane, and un-named roads, as signposted on site

BUTTERMERE CLOSE, FOLKESTONE

Road closed for entire length

There is no alternative route as the road is a *cul-de-sac*

CANTERBURY ROAD, FOLKESTONE

Closure between A259 Black Bull Road and A260 Dover Road

Alternative route via A259 Canterbury Road, A260 Hill Road and Dover Road

NORTH ROAD / BARTHOLOMEW LANE, HYTHE

Closure between Brockhill Road and Barrack Hill

Alternative route via Hillcrest Road and Brockhill Road

FIVE VENTS LANE, OLD ROMNEY

Closure between A259 Lydd Road and Ashford Road

Alternative route via A259 Lydd Road, High Street and Ashford Road

STOCKHAM LANE, SELSTED/ SWINGFIELD

Closure between A260 Canterbury Road and Swanton Lane

Alternative route via A260 Canterbury Road, Boyington Lane, Oak Hill and Swanton Lane

THORN LANE & DEAN HILL, STELLING MINNIS

Closure between B2068 Stone Street and Lower Waltham Road

Alternative route via B2068 Stone Street, Wadden Hall, Gogway, Duckpit Road and Lower Waltham Road

BRABOURNE LANE, STOWTING

Closure between Stowting Hill and Scots Lane

Alternative route via Stowting Hill, Stowting Court Road and Scots Lane
